149 Proposed Estimates 2016/2017

Councillor Dyson, Member with Special Responsibility for Finance, presented the report of proposed estimates for 2016/2017 which had been attached to the agenda for Members consideration.

RESOLVED: That:

- 1) the Town Council Precept for 2016/2017 be set at £419,135 representing £60.55 Parish Tax at Council Tax Band 'D' a year; an increase of 25p on 2015/16.
- 2) the breakdown of estimates for 2016/2017 be agreed (as attached schedule).
- 3) Cllr Addis be thanked for his report on the Sidbury Drinking Fountain; that budget to be set at £250 to enable water supply but no refurbishment.
- 4) The service agreement with Young Devon be increased by £11,521 to £35,521 to enable an additional evening of youth support and staff time for fund raising and grant applications. The Youth Service Support budget be increased by £6,000 to set it at £30,000 and the remaining £5,521 be taken from the Youth Provision Contingency Earmarked Reserve.
- 5) The Manor Pavilion/Arts Centre Contingency Earmarked Reserve be reduced by £20,000 to enable a reduction to this year's precept.

151 WOOLLEY BEQUEST

Members were asked to consider and confirm future Woolley Bequest funding allocations. **RESOLVED:** That:

- an amount of £10,000 be allocated from the Woolley Bequest to support the Admiral Nurse campaign. A further £5,000 per annum for five years be pledged from the Woolley Bequest from 2017/18 onwards dependent on when an Admiral Nurse is appointed and remains in post.
- 2) an amount of £15,000 be set aside in the Woolley Bequest to enable support of two potential forthcoming events in Sidmouth during 2016.

Members were asked to consider Grant applications for the financial year 2016/2017.

RESOLVED: That 2016/2017 Grants be allocated to organisations at a total of £14,680; as per the attached schedule. This allocation will utilise the 2016/17 budget of £12,000, the grant reserve brought forward of £2,190 and will result in an over budget spend of £490 during 2016/17.
