### 61 Natural Environment:

- Jan Metcalf reported on the section of the Lower Reaches of the river Sid. After examining the river, it was noticed the potential of sewage fungi on both the walkway and at the Ford.

  Reports have been made to the Environment Agency and monitors would be approached to collect data and help us achieve our goal of having the cleanest river in the UK.
- 61.2 Charles Sinclair from River Sid Partnership gave a verbal update regarding their ongoing work on the River Sid project and work with South West Water.
- 61.3 Ed Dolphin gave a summary on behalf of the Biodiversity Group discussing the verge at The Bowd and Brownlands.

### **RECOMMENDED:**

A brief leaflet to be made and distributed to the residents of Brownlands, explaining the planting and seeding process.

- 61.4 Jon Ball from the Arboretum gave an update on the 10-year treeconomics report.
- 61.5 Councillor Kevin Walker gave a summary of the report from the new Friends of the Knowle Group and their activities.

It was agreed that usage of the parkland would be considered at the next meeting in the context of the Councils existing policy 'guidelines on events in the Sid Valley'.
